$$s^2 Y + 3sY + 2Y = e^{-s}$$

$$Y = \frac{1}{(s+1)(s+2)} e^{-s}$$

$$= \underbrace{\left( \frac{1}{s+1} - \frac{1}{s+2} \right)}_{\bar{f}(s)} e^{-s}$$

$$f(t) = \mathcal{L}^{-1}(\bar{f}) = e^{-t} - e^{-2t}$$

$$y = \mathcal{L}^{-1} \{ \bar{f}(s) \cdot e^{-s} \}$$

$$= f(t-1) u(t-1) = \begin{cases} 0 & 0 \leq t < 1 \\ e^{-(t-1)} - e^{-2(t-1)} & t > 1 \end{cases}$$

5.4 Differentiation and Integration of Transforms

$$\bar{f}(s) = \mathcal{L}\{f\} = \int_0^{\infty} e^{-st} f(t) dt$$

$$\bar{f}'(s) = - \int_0^{\infty} e^{-st} [t f(t)] dt$$

$$\therefore \mathcal{L}\{t f(t)\} = -\bar{f}'(s) = -\frac{d}{ds} \mathcal{L}\{f\}$$

$$\bar{f}'(s) = \mathcal{L}\{-t f\}$$

$$\mathcal{L}^{-1}\{\bar{f}'(s)\} = -t f(t)$$

Ex. 1.  $\mathcal{L}\{t \sin \beta t\} = -\frac{d}{ds} \mathcal{L}\{\sin \beta t\} = -\frac{d}{ds} \cdot \left( \frac{\beta}{s^2 + \beta^2} \right)$

$$= \frac{\beta \cdot 2s}{(s^2 + \beta^2)^2} = \frac{2\beta s}{(s^2 + \beta^2)^2}$$

$$\begin{aligned}
 \mathcal{L}(t \cos \beta t) &= -\frac{d}{ds} \mathcal{L}(\cos \beta t) \\
 &= -\frac{d}{ds} \left( \frac{s}{s^2 + \beta^2} \right) \\
 &= -\frac{s^2 + \beta^2 - 2s^2}{(s^2 + \beta^2)^2} \\
 &= \frac{s^2 - \beta^2}{(s^2 + \beta^2)^2}
 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned}
 \mathcal{L}(\sin \beta t - \beta t \cos \beta t) &= \frac{\beta}{s^2 + \beta^2} - \beta \frac{s^2 - \beta^2}{(s^2 + \beta^2)^2} \\
 &= \beta \frac{s^2 + \beta^2 - s^2 + \beta^2}{(s^2 + \beta^2)^2} = \frac{2\beta^3}{(s^2 + \beta^2)^2}
 \end{aligned}$$

$$\mathcal{L}(\sin \beta t + \beta t \cos \beta t) = \frac{2\beta s^2}{(s^2 + \beta^2)^2}$$

\* Integration of Transforms

$$\mathcal{L} \left\{ \frac{f(t)}{t} \right\} = \int_s^{\infty} f(\tilde{s}) d\tilde{s}$$

$$\mathcal{L}^{-1} \left\{ \int_s^{\infty} f(\tilde{s}) d\tilde{s} \right\} = \frac{f(t)}{t}$$

Proof.

$$\begin{aligned}
 \int_s^{\infty} f(\tilde{s}) d\tilde{s} &= \int_s^{\infty} \left[ \int_0^{\infty} e^{-\tilde{s}t} f(t) dt \right] d\tilde{s} \\
 &= \int_0^{\infty} \left[ \int_s^{\infty} e^{-\tilde{s}t} f(t) d\tilde{s} \right] dt \\
 &= \int_0^{\infty} f(t) \left[ \int_s^{\infty} e^{-\tilde{s}t} d\tilde{s} \right] dt \\
 &\quad \parallel \\
 &\quad -\frac{1}{t} [e^{-\tilde{s}t}]_s^{\infty} = -\frac{1}{t} (0 - e^{-st}) = \frac{e^{-st}}{t} \\
 &= \int_0^{\infty} e^{-st} \frac{f(t)}{t} dt = \mathcal{L} \left\{ \frac{f(t)}{t} \right\}
 \end{aligned}$$

Ex. 2  $\mathcal{L}^{-1} \left\{ \ln \left( 1 + \frac{\omega^2}{s^2} \right) \right\}$

$$\frac{d}{ds} \left[ \ln \left( 1 + \frac{\omega^2}{s^2} \right) \right] = \frac{-2\omega^2 s^{-3}}{1 + \frac{\omega^2}{s^2}} = \frac{-2\omega^2}{s^3 + \omega^2 s}$$

$$= \frac{-2\omega^2}{s(s^2 + \omega^2)}$$

$$= -2\omega^2 \cdot \left( \frac{a}{s} + \frac{bs+c}{s^2 + \omega^2} \right)$$

$$\begin{cases} as^2 + a\omega^2 + bs^2 + cs = 1 \\ (a+b)s^2 + cs + a\omega^2 = 1 \\ a = \frac{1}{\omega^2}, \quad b = -\frac{1}{\omega^2}, \quad c = 0 \end{cases}$$

$$= -2\omega^2 \left( \frac{1}{\omega^2} \frac{1}{s} - \frac{1}{\omega^2} \frac{s}{s^2 + \omega^2} \right)$$

$$= -2 \left( \frac{1}{s} - \frac{s}{s^2 + \omega^2} \right)$$

$$\int_s^\infty -2 \left( \frac{1}{s} - \frac{s}{s^2 + \omega^2} \right) ds = \left[ \ln \left( 1 + \frac{\omega^2}{s^2} \right) \right]_s^\infty = -\ln \left( 1 + \frac{\omega^2}{s^2} \right)$$

$$\therefore \mathcal{L}^{-1} \left\{ \ln \left( 1 + \frac{\omega^2}{s^2} \right) \right\} = \mathcal{L}^{-1} \left\{ \int_s^\infty z \left( \frac{1}{s} - \frac{s}{s^2 + \omega^2} \right) ds \right\} = \frac{f(t)}{t}$$

$$f(t) = \mathcal{L}^{-1} \left\{ z \left( \frac{1}{s} - \frac{s}{s^2 + \omega^2} \right) \right\} = z (1 - \cos \omega t)$$

$$\therefore \mathcal{L}^{-1} \left\{ \ln \left( 1 + \frac{\omega^2}{s^2} \right) \right\} = \frac{z}{t} (1 - \cos \omega t)$$

Ex. 3  $\mathcal{L}^{-1} \left\{ \ln \left( 1 - \frac{a^2}{s^2} \right) \right\} = \frac{z}{t} (1 - \cosh at)$       HW

\* Differential Eq with Variable Coefficients

$$a(t)y'' + b(t)y' + c(t)y = 0.$$

$$\mathcal{L}(ty') = -\frac{d}{ds} \mathcal{L}(y) = -\frac{d}{ds} [sY - y(0)] = -Y - s \frac{dY}{ds}$$

$$\mathcal{L}(ty'') = -\frac{d}{ds} \mathcal{L}(y'') = -\frac{d}{ds} [s^2 Y - sy(0) - y'(0)] = -2sY - s^2 \frac{dY}{ds} + y(0)$$

Ex. 4. Laguerre's diff. eq..

$$ty'' + (1-t)y' + my = 0. \quad (m=0, 1, 2, \dots)$$

L.T.

$$[-2sY - s^2 \frac{dY}{ds} + y(0)] + sY - y(0) - (-Y - s \frac{dY}{ds}) + nY = 0$$

$$(s-s^2) \frac{dY}{ds} + (n+1-s)Y = 0$$

$$\frac{dY}{Y} = - \frac{n+1-s}{s-s^2} ds = \left( \frac{a}{s} + \frac{b}{s-1} \right) ds$$

$$\underset{\text{||}}{s(1-s)}$$

$$as - a + bs = (a+b)s - a$$

$$a+b = -1$$

$$n+1 = -a$$

$$b = -1 - a$$

$$= -1 + n+1 = n$$

$$\frac{dY}{Y} = \left[ \frac{-(n+1)}{s} + \frac{n}{s-1} \right] ds$$

$$\ln Y = n \ln(s-1) - (n+1) \ln s + c$$

$$= \ln \frac{(s-1)^n}{s^{n+1}} + c$$

$$Y = c \frac{(s-1)^n}{s^{n+1}}$$

Take  $c=1$  for simplicity

$$Y = \frac{(s-1)^n}{s^{n+1}}$$

$$\text{if } n=0: Y = \frac{1}{s}, \quad y=1$$

$$\text{Note } \mathcal{L}\{t^n e^{-t}\} = \frac{n!}{(s+1)^{n+1}}$$

$$\begin{aligned} \text{also } \mathcal{L}\{(t^n e^{-t})^{(m)}\} &= s^m \mathcal{L}\{t^n e^{-t}\} - s^{m-1} \mathcal{L}\{t^n e^{-t}\} \dots \\ &= \frac{n! s^m}{(s+1)^{n+1}} \end{aligned}$$

$$\text{Using this, we get } \mathcal{L}\left\{ \frac{e^t}{n!} \frac{d^n}{dt^n} (t^n e^{-t}) \right\} = \frac{(s-1)^n}{s^{n+1}} = Y$$

$$\mathcal{L}^{-1}\{Y\} = y = \ln(t) = \frac{e^t}{n!} \frac{d^n}{dt^n} (t^n e^{-t}) \quad \text{for } n=1, 2, \dots \quad \text{for } n=0$$

6.5. Convolution

Theorem 1. Convolution theorem

$$F(s) = \mathcal{L}(f), \quad G(s) = \mathcal{L}(g)$$

$$F(s) \cdot G(s) = H(s) = \mathcal{L}(h)$$

$$h(t) = (f * g)(t) = \int_0^t f(\tau) g(t-\tau) d\tau$$

convolution of f and g

$$h = \mathcal{L}^{-1}(F \cdot G)$$

Pf.

$$F(s) \cdot G(s) = \int_0^{\infty} e^{-s\tau} f(\tau) d\tau \cdot G(s)$$

$$= \int_0^{\infty} \underbrace{e^{-s\tau} G(s)}_{\text{...}} f(\tau) d\tau$$

$$e^{-s\tau} G(s) = \mathcal{L}\{g(t-\tau) u(t-\tau)\}$$

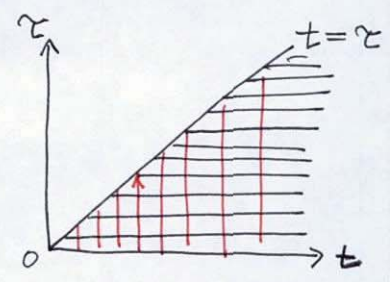
$$= \int_0^{\infty} e^{-st} g(t-\tau) u(t-\tau) dt$$

$$= \int_{\tau}^{\infty} e^{-st} g(t-\tau) dt$$

$$F(s) G(s) = \int_0^{\infty} f(\tau) \left[ \int_{\tau}^{\infty} e^{-st} g(t-\tau) dt \right] d\tau \quad s > k$$

$\begin{cases} t: \tau \rightarrow \infty \\ \tau: 0 \rightarrow \infty \end{cases}$

$\begin{cases} \tau: 0 \rightarrow t \\ t: 0 \rightarrow \infty \end{cases}$



$$\begin{aligned}
 F(s)G(s) &= \int_0^{\infty} e^{-st} \underbrace{\int_0^t f(\tau)g(t-\tau) d\tau}_{h(t)} dt \\
 &= \int_0^{\infty} e^{-st} h(t) dt = \mathcal{L}(h)
 \end{aligned}$$

Ex. 1\*

$$H(s) = \frac{1}{(s^2+1)^2}$$

$$h(t) = \mathcal{L}^{-1}(H) = ?$$

$$H(s) = \frac{1}{(s^2+1)} \cdot \frac{1}{(s^2+1)} = \mathcal{L}(\sin t) \cdot \mathcal{L}(\sin t)$$

$$h = \sin t * \sin t$$

$$= \int_0^t \sin \tau \sin(t-\tau) d\tau$$

$$= \int_0^t \frac{1}{2} [\cos(2\tau-t) - \cos t] d\tau$$

$$= \frac{1}{2} \left[ \frac{1}{2} \sin(2\tau-t) - \tau \cos t \right]_0^t$$

$$= \frac{1}{2} \left[ \frac{1}{2} \sin t - t \cos t + \frac{1}{2} \sin t \right]$$

$$= \frac{1}{2} (\sin t - t \cos t)$$

Ex. 2\*

$$H(s) = \frac{1}{s^3} = \frac{1}{s^2} \cdot \frac{1}{s} = \mathcal{L}(t) \cdot \mathcal{L}(1)$$

$$h = \mathcal{L}^{-1}(H) = t * 1$$

$$= \int_0^t \tau \cdot 1 d\tau = \frac{t^2}{2}$$

Ex. 3.  
eg

$$H(s) = \frac{1}{s^2(s-a)} = \frac{1}{s^2} \cdot \frac{1}{s-a}$$

$$= \mathcal{L}(t) \mathcal{L}(e^{at})$$

$$h = t * e^{at} = \int_0^t \underbrace{\tau}_{u} \underbrace{e^{a(t-\tau)}}_{v} d\tau$$

$$= \left[ \tau \cdot \frac{1}{-a} e^{a(t-\tau)} \right]_0^t + \frac{1}{a} \int_0^t e^{a(t-\tau)} d\tau$$

$$= -\frac{t}{a} - \frac{1}{a^2} \left[ e^{a(t-\tau)} \right]_0^t$$

$$= -\frac{t}{a} - \frac{1}{a^2} (1 - e^{at})$$

$$= \frac{1}{a^2} (e^{at} - at - 1)$$

\* Properties of the convolution

$$f * g = g * f \quad : \text{commutative law}$$

$$f * (g_1 + g_2) = f * g_1 + f * g_2 \quad : \text{distributive law}$$

$$(f * g) * v = f * (g * v) \quad : \text{associative law}$$

$$f * 0 = 0 * f = 0.$$

$$f * 1 \neq f$$

Application to nonhomogeneous  
\* Differential Eq

$$y'' + ay' + by = r(t) \quad y(0) = y'(0) = 0$$

$$(s^2 + as + b)Y = R$$

$$Y = QR \quad Q = \frac{1}{s^2 + as + b} \text{ : transfer fm.}$$

$$y = \underset{+}{f} * r \quad f = \mathcal{L}^{-1}(Q)$$

$$= \int_0^t f(t-\tau) r(\tau) d\tau$$

Ex. 4.

$$y'' + 3y' + 2y = r(t) \quad y(0) = y'(0) = 0$$

$$r(t) = \begin{cases} 0 & 0 < t < 1 \\ 1 & 1 < t < 2 \\ 0 & t > 2 \end{cases}$$

$$Y = QR \quad Q = \frac{1}{s^2 + 3s + 2} = \frac{1}{(s+1)(s+2)} = \frac{1}{s+1} - \frac{1}{s+2}$$

$$y = \int_0^t \underbrace{f(t-\tau)}_{\substack{+ \\ \text{transfer}}} r(\tau) d\tau \quad f(t) = \mathcal{L}^{-1}(Q) = e^{-t} - e^{-2t}$$

$$0 < t < 1 : y = 0$$

$$1 < t < 2 : y = \int_0^t f(t-\tau) r(\tau) d\tau$$

$$= \int_1^t [e^{-(t-\tau)} - e^{-2(t-\tau)}] d\tau$$

$$= [e^{-(t-\tau)} - \frac{1}{2} e^{-2(t-\tau)}]_1^t$$

$$= 1 - \frac{1}{2} - (e^{-(t-1)} - \frac{1}{2} e^{-2(t-1)})$$

$$= \frac{1}{2} - e^{-(t-1)} + \frac{1}{2} e^{-2(t-1)}$$



$$t > 2 \quad y = \int_0^t \sim dt = \int_1^2 q(t-\tau) r(\tau) d\tau$$

$$= e^{-(t-2)} - e^{-(t-1)} - \frac{1}{2} [e^{-2(t-2)} - e^{-2(t-1)}]$$

\* Integral Eq.

Ex. 5. <sup>6</sup>  
 $y(t) = t + \int_0^t y(\tau) \sin(t-\tau) d\tau$

$$y = t + (y * \sin t)$$

$$Y = \frac{1}{s^2} + Y \cdot \frac{1}{s^2+1}$$

$$Y(1 - \frac{1}{s^2+1}) = \frac{1}{s^2}$$

$$Y = \frac{s^2+1}{s^4} = \frac{1}{s^2} + \frac{1}{s^4}$$

$$= \frac{1}{s^2} + \frac{3!}{s^4} \cdot \frac{1}{3!}$$

$$y = \mathcal{L}^{-1}(Y) = t + \frac{1}{6} t^3 \quad \rightarrow \text{p. 153}$$

§ 5.6. Partial Fractions

Case 1. Unrepeated factor  $(s-a)$

Ex. 1.  $y'' + y' - 6y = 1$ .  $y(0) = 0$ .  $y'(0) = 1$

$$Y(s) = \frac{s+1}{s(s-2)(s+3)} = \frac{A_1}{s} + \frac{A_2}{s-2} + \frac{A_3}{s+3}$$

$$A_1 = -\frac{1}{6}, \quad A_2 = \frac{3}{10}, \quad A_3 = -\frac{2}{15}$$
